
The Meeks Family

Meet the Meeks family. Brian and Marika had no plans to relocate to Arizona, but after Marika was diagnosed with stage three breast cancer and they were looking for the very best treatment options, they found an answer in Arizona, which became a temporary place to call home.

Even though the couple owned and operated several restaurants in Fort Wayne, IN, their brush with death taught them just how short life really is, and when they fell in love with Arizona during Marika's treatment, they dropped everything, sold the restaurants and picked up and moved.



Carly (22) and Caitie (19), the couple's daughters, also decided that Arizona was the place they wanted to call home and currently attend Arizona State University.

The family had suffered through the trauma of a cancer diagnosis and even though it seemed Marika, against the odds, was going to survive, cancer had left an indelible mark on the family.

When a new family member entered the Meeks' home, things suddenly changed, only this time it was for the better The family adopted Stella, a young Pitbull-mix pup who had been dumped in a field with her sister. The day that Stella came home, the family, who had been broken and filled with fear and anxiety, started to heal. Stella gave the family, and in particular Marika, a new, positive, tail-wagging, happy focus.

Since that day, Stella has gone on to become a social media darling (@Incredibullstella) and a local celebrity. With tens of thousands of followers, many TV appearances and over 25 million video views, Marika and Stella work hard to help as many other people and animals as possible.


Leveraging their large audience, the pair work with national companies, such as Halo Pet Food, to get food, toys and supplies donated to help local animal shelters. Stella is a dog influencer and Marika is an influencer for lifestyle brands for companies such as CoolSculpting<sup>®</sup>, and Ring<sup>®</sup>, in addition to inspiring speaking engagements at conferences and corporate events.





*Here's a dog with a story that's worth telling. Meet Ellie, a* black-and-white beauty who has had a tough life, a life that almost ended until she got a second chance.

Ellie was picked up as a stray in downtown Phoenix and spent several months at Maricopa Animal Care and Control. Ellie wasn't aggressive, or sick, but she ended up on the euthanasia list because she was simply too afraid to be adopted.

Shut down and terrified, Ellie was doing poorly at the shelter. Distraught at the sad ending that Ellie was soon facing, a shelter volunteer approached Paradise Valley residents (and experienced foster dog parents) Brian and Marika Meeks and asked if they could help.

Ellie was the worst case that the Meekses had ever seen, and they were doubtful that they could help her. She hid in the corner and seemed especially fearful of men. But Stella, the Meekses' dog, did what humans could not do and quickly took Ellie under her wing and, for the first time, Ellie found a support system and a positive relationship.

Slowly, unbelievably, Ellie started to improve. She gave little signs that there might be hope after all. A tail wag, or a tentative lick, Ellie was showing that underneath this terrified exterior was a dog that just wanted to feel safe and loved.

Through Stella's social media accounts, Ellie became a celebrity herself and people around the world started rooting for Ellie, the

ultimate underdog, to find happiness. Ellie's story was then picked up by Animal Planet and has gone on to inspire over a million people.

Although still fearful, Ellie has made tremendous progress, and the Meekses are giving her more time to rehabilitate while they look for a fur-ever family to adopt her.
